If you decide to stay at the St. Francis Inn, you will be sleeping in the oldest inn in the oldest city. This charming little bed and breakfast has history that dates back to the 1700s. The rooms are delightfully cozy, retaining their old world charm yet providing every comfort you can imagine. Breakfasts, refreshments throughout the day, a happy hour in the evening and nightly desserts are offered from Chef Janice Leary. Owners Joe and Margaret Finnegan have done a fantastic job of maintaining the inn that is on the National Register of Historic Places and providing an oasis of comfort in true Floridian style.

St. Augustine is a great destination, whether you are a history geek or nature lover, party person or foodie. You can relax and enjoy the beach, or head out to discover and explore. St. Augustine is pedestrian friendly, especially in the historic district where most monuments and museums are located. The city was, after all, the oldest continuously occupied European-established settlement and port in the continental United States and still serves as the headquarters for the Florida National Guard. Be sure to visit the Castillo de San Marcos, Lighthouse, Flagler College, Lightner Museum, Cathedral Basilica and County Jail – all notable characters in the city's long history.

ECO TOUR ON THE WATER: Walk over to the marina for an eco-adventure with Zach McKenna of St. Augustine Eco Tours. His team takes you by boat into the waters to discover local marine life such as dolphins, birds, manatees and, on a good day, even jelly fish and crabs.
